Rebecca K. Oyler has served since February 2021 as President and CEO of the Pennsylvania Motor Truck Association (PMTA), a statewide organization founded in 1928 to preserve, strengthen, and promote the interests of the trucking industry in Pennsylvania.

Rebecca regularly testifies before legislative committees and provides insight on issues critical to the trucking industry. She has represented PMTA on several committees, including Governor Wolf's Transportation Revenue Options Commission, the Pennsylvania Motor Carrier Safety Advisory Committee, the Transportation Advisory Committee, and the Small Business Compliance Advisory Committee.

Before joining PMTA, Rebecca served as Pennsylvania Legislative Director for the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB), where she managed government relations, advocating on behalf of small businesses in the state. Prior to joining NFIB, she worked in policy development, legislative advocacy, and project management in many areas of state government for nearly 20 years. As Director of Policy for the Pennsylvania Department of State and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, and as a policy specialist at the Department of Community and Economic Development, she advanced policy and legislative initiatives in areas related to: economic development, elections, voter registration, natural resources, corporations, professional licensing, and notaries. She also taught as adjunct faculty in Millersville University's Department of Government and Political Affairs. Prior to returning to central Pennsylvania, Rebecca worked as a staff assistant at the American Enterprise Institute.

Rebecca serves her community through involvement with her church, Mechanicsburg's St. James Presbyterian, and as a Girl Scout Troop Leader. She is a graduate of the Executive Leaders Program, the commonwealth's Leadership Development Institute, and is a member of Women in Pennsylvania Government Relations.
